

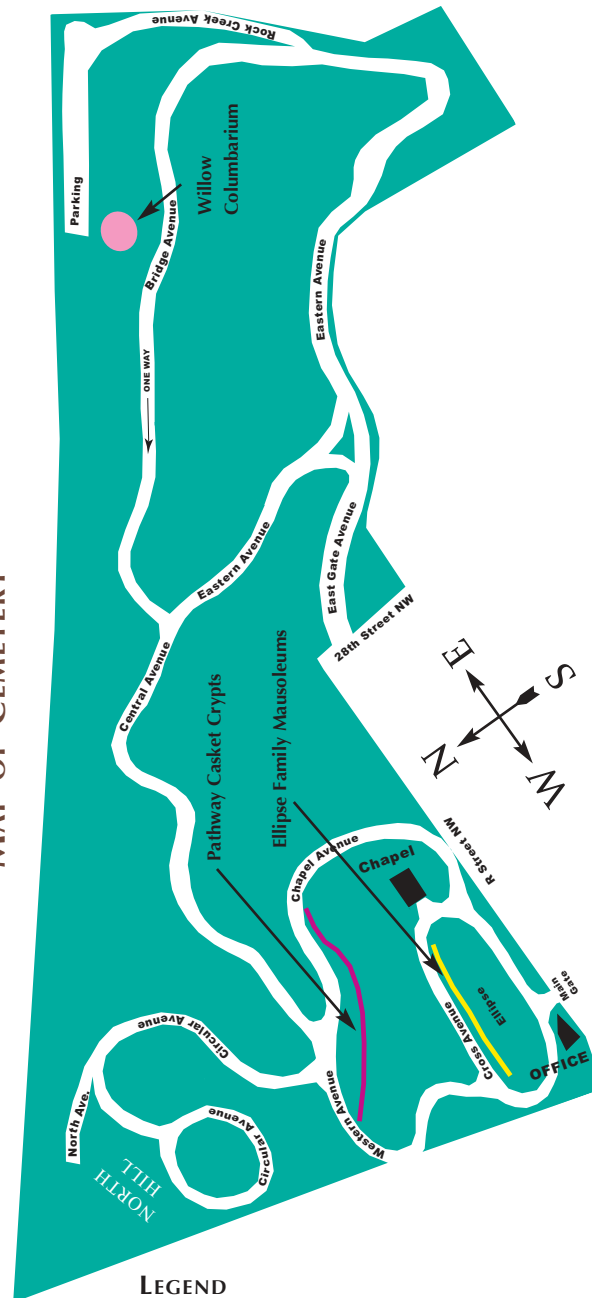


DOUBLE CASSET LAWN SITES

The original design of Oak Hill Cemetery provided for literally hundreds of plots for families who planned for several generations of burials. Such sites are still in use but all were sold years ago. In a few areas the land was divided into individual burial sites or was originally set aside for other uses. Within these areas remain a number of sites capable of accepting two caskets, one set over the other.

Owners will have the opportunity to memorialize their loved ones with traditional full size monuments, blended among those already in place, some of which have been set for well over 100 years. The sites are in various locations in the cemetery. Please see our staff for locations

PATHWAY CASKET CRYPTS

As Captain de la Roche's mid-nineteenth century pathways are being renovated and restored, a limited number of double and single crypts for casket interments will be installed underground where side slopes are not too steep and shade tree rooting systems do not prevail. New granite walkways will be set in mortar beds above the crypts and will include five sections defining each site and serving as a ledger stone. Owners are offered the choice of engraving memorial inscriptions on one or three of its five stones covering the crypt. Each stone spans the full width of the pathway and is eighteen inches long. Both double depth and single crypts are available.

ELLIPSE FAMILY MAUSOLEUMS

Along the north border of our historic ellipse where the lovely Heron Fountain bubbles and sculptures in memory of John Howard Payne and the Reverend Pinkney stand, a series of family mausoleum sites offer a unique opportunity unmatched in the Washington, DC area. Lightly screened from the south by seasonal flower beds and mature shrubs, these exclusive sites are set between flowering tulip trees and are reached directly by Cross Avenue. A short distance from the historic Renwick Chapel, each location commands vistas of the cemetery's most beautiful landscape features and the century's old monuments they contain. A family mausoleum erected here would be an important structure for generations to come.

Each site can accommodate a custom built mausoleum designed to accept two or more caskets or several cremation urns or perhaps a combination of both. The cemetery will work with the family and architects, sculptors, and builders to develop a structure tailored to their wishes. The result will be a group of attractive and unique structures whose appearances will bear the test of time honoring the loved ones of the owners.
