

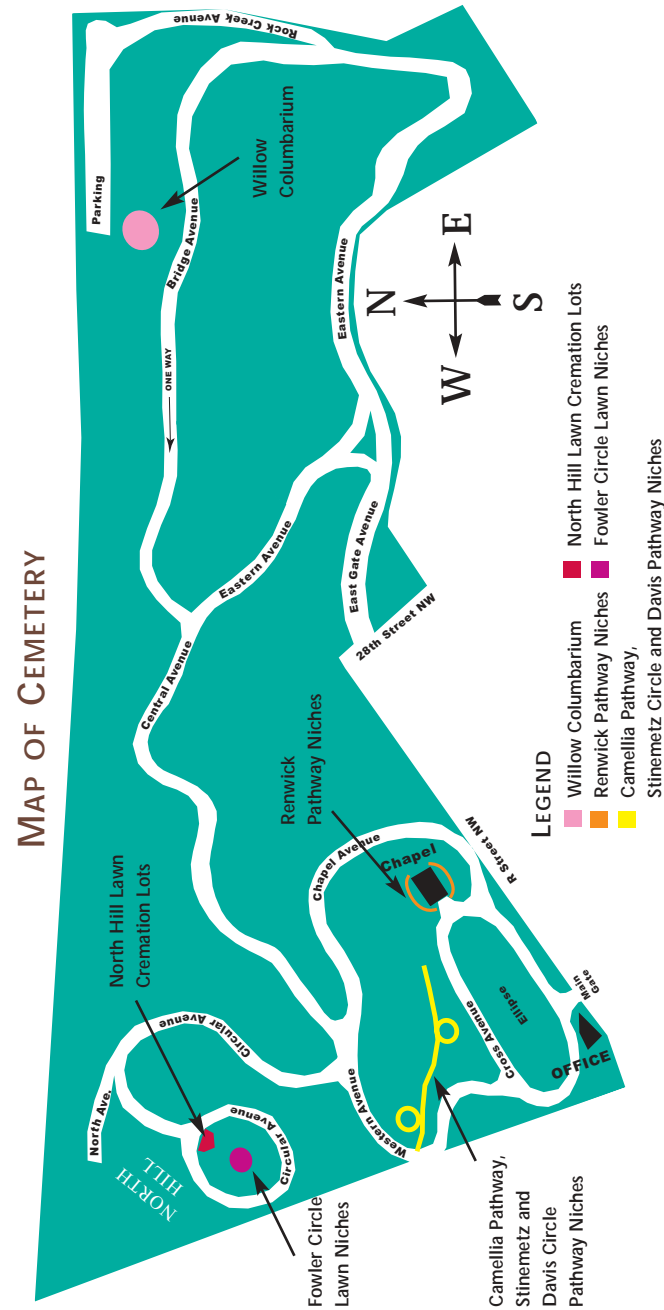


WILLOW COLUMBARIUM

Looking downhill past iron railings, a splendid view of the Columbarium can be seen with central seating, planter and cast stone urn. The Willow logo designed by Brian Williamson and executed in granite by sculptor Andrew Del Gallo is pendant to Del Gallo's rendition of the Oak Hill seal.

If one walks into the columbarium, two more angel reliefs by Del Gallo have been installed. To the northwest is a horizontal figure of a weeping angel which is cut both as relief and intaglio. The second figure is a vertical composition of an exultant angel.

The Columbarium is easily accessible by a lower parking lot off the cemetery's Rock Creek Avenue. The interior is circular and has a seating area around the sculpted urn also offering spectacular views. Lining the interior walls are cremation niches for double and a limited number of multiple urn interments. Each interment niche is sealed with a black slate memorial cover that can be carved with original artwork and lettering of your choice.

NORTH HILL LAWN CREMATION LOTS

The North Hill Lawn Cremation Lots area is located to the north of Circular Avenue. These sites are for cremation inurnments, each measuring approximately four feet square. They are designed to accommodate two inurnments and a memorial stone. Monuments may be flat or a slightly raised design as desired by the lot holder.

FOWLER CIRCLE LAWN NICHES

The Fowler Circle is located at the northwest corner of the cemetery and is near Montrose Park. It offers sites for cremation inurnments, each measuring approximately four feet square. They are designed to accommodate two inurnments and a memorial stone. Monuments may be an upright or flat ledger-style design as desired by the lot holder.

CAMELLIA PATHWAY, STINEMETZ CIRCLE AND DAVIS CIRCLE PATHWAY NICHES

These inurnment niches, similar in design to the Renwick Pathway niches, are located along the Camellia Pathway located in the Chapel Hill area of the Cemetery. The Stinemetz and Davis Circles connect to Camellia Pathway. Double and single niches are available, each with a piece of granite which will serve as a ledger stone for inscriptions.



RENWICK PATHWAY NICHES

The Cemetery's historic Chapel, designed by James Renwick and constructed in the 1850's, is encircled by a walk-path providing double urn niches for cremated remains. The path begins and ends at the sides of the Renwick Chapel, making access to the site quite desirable.

Each niche is located under a granite cover measuring approximately 48" X 24". Niches are designed to accommodate two urns with the personalized memorial inscribed on the granite cover. Inscriptions range from artful creations and figures carved into the cover, to names and dates inscribed in a variety of styles. Each is unique and selected by family members, with approval by the Cemetery.

CUSTOM DESIGNS

Private group and family inurnment sites are available throughout the Cemetery in areas where the terraces can accommodate smaller custom designs. These areas are designed jointly by the family and the Cemetery, and the Cemetery will oversee the construct of the area according to the jointly agreed-upon plan. Several such sites are available for viewing upon request.
